Upon further review in August 2021, Indiana University-Purdue University-Indianapolis, University of Alabama at Birmingham, University of Colorado at Denver and Health Sciences Center, University of Illinois at Chicago, University of Oklahoma-Norman Campus, University of Utah, Virginia Commonwealth University, and Wayne State University were **removed**. Portland State University, University of Cincinnati-Main Campus, University of Maryland-Baltimore County, University of Massachusetts-Boston, University of Massachusetts-Lowell, University of Memphis, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, and University of North Carolina at Greensboro were **added**. University of Louisville is no longer considered an operational peer.
