Reason	ILL documents increased a lot in FY20 because of library closures due to COVID-19. The ILL office was able to reopen for lending – with precautions place – earlier than other ILL offices around the country. As such, we were able to fill a large number of requests, ones that probably would have bee filled by other libraries if they had been able to reopen when we were.

Reason	Increase in Fringe Benefits: The difference in benefit costs is because we hired a new library dean at the start of FY20. This resulted in higher beneficosts (from the previous interim director) as well as some one time moving and relocation expenses. Additionally, the medical insurance cost increase for all employees.
