- In fiscal year 2005, UM Health Care provided uncompensated care for 69,111 patients worth \$44 million.

- 13,331 patients seen at the UMKC School of Dentistry in fiscal year 2005, with \$414,000 of uncompensated care.
- 1,329,988 visits to MU Extension in 2005.
- 18,390 firefighters and first responders were trained by MU Extension in 2005.

Economic Development Highlights

- With \$2.1 billion in total revenues and more than 25,000 employees, UM is the 21st largest publicly-held company in the state.
- UM research is an economic engine; the University conducts five dollars of research for every one dollar directly invested by the state.
- UM earned 67% of total funding awarded by the National Science Foundation in Missouri in fiscal year 2005.
- 160 patents and licenses and over \$9 million in licensing income in 2005.

- The Missouri Bibliographic Information User System (MOBIUS) has loaned 248,000 books from higher education institutions to state students.
