### Services Received in the State:

- In fiscal year 2006, UM Health Care provided uncompensated care for 71,587 patients worth more than \$47 million.
- 3,579 patients seen at the UMSL Center for Eye Care in fiscal year 2006, with \$303,000 of uncompensated care.
- 12,791 patients seen at the UMKC School of Dentistry in fiscal year 2006, with \$344,000 of uncompensated care.
- 1,184,668 contacts with MU Extension in 2006.
- 19,244 firefighters and first responders were trained by MU Extension in 2006.

### Amount of Tax Revenue Generated in the State by University Employees:

- \$126 million

### Economic Development Highlights

- With \$2.2 billion in total revenues and more than 25,000 employees, UM is the 21<sup>st</sup> largest publicly-held company in the state.
- 40% of Missouri's academic science and technology research expenditures were conducted at UM.
- UM earned 51% of total funding awarded in Missouri by the National Science Foundation in 2006.
- Federal grant funding at UM increased 13.4% in 2005 to \$193 million.
- 172 patents and licenses and \$2.4 million in licensing income in 2006.

### Electronic Services to the State

- The Missouri Research & Education Network (MOREnet) served 67 higher education institutions with 336,000 students and 38,000 faculty and staff.
- MOREnet served 514 school districts with 860,000 students and 75,000 faculty and staff.
- The Missouri Bibliographic Information User System (MOBIUS) has loaned 250,000 books from higher education institutions to state students.
