# The 1999-2000 Report of Degrees Awarded by the University of Missouri

This report discusses the annual number of degrees awarded by the University of Missouri System from fiscal year 1979-80 (FY80) through fiscal year 1999-2000 (FY00). The figures and tables of this report display the distribution of awards by campus and level (Table 1), by campus college (Tables 2.1-2.4), and by campus college department (Tables 3.1-3.4). In addition, the long-term trend of degrees awarded is shown graphically by campus (Figure 1) and by degree level within campus (Figure 2). Degrees awarded are reported by department in the accompanying document *Department Detail Summary*. In all cases, academic degree programs that have moved from one unit to another and units that have moved from one school to another have been reported as if they had always been where they are now. The official annual reporting period is from July 1 to June 30 of the following calendar year. For example, FY00 includes summer and fall graduates from 1999 and the spring graduates of 2000. The data tables of the report show percentage annual change from FY99 to FY00 and FY00 relative to the prior 5-year and 10-year averages. Collectively, these statistics help to communicate whether recent change in production is short- or long-term. Please note the axis scale range when considering graphs.

While the principal application of these data is to respond to inquiries about specific programs, a perspective of more than 20 years provides a unique opportunity to examine one very important aspect of the University's academic contribution. The past 20 years was a period when the traditional pool of potential students declined by about 30% (*Statistical Abstract for Missouri*, Table A-9) even though the population of Missouri increased by about 10% (*Statistical Abstract for Missouri*, A-6). The period also included two economic downturns when annual state tax revenue increased very little, one near 1980 and the other in the early 1990s (*Statistical Abstract for Missouri*, Table G-1). Given these changes and the many other changes that have occurred in Missouri over the most recent 20 years, the overall stability of number of degrees awarded is remarkable. In FY80, the University of Missouri awarded 9,760 degrees and 20 years later, it awarded 10,934. These endpoints are relatively close in size to the 20-year annual average of 10,440. Said another way, from a high in FY93 (11,176) to a low in FY81 (9,702), the range is only 1,474 degrees. In comparison with the prior 5- and 10-year periods, overall degree production in FY00 was higher by 4% and 2% respectively but was down 1% annually.

- The Figure 1 charts show that each campus has managed to generally maintain degree production levels over a 20-year period in spite of the very sharp decline in number of traditional college aged students A decline that has only recently began to recover.
- On the other hand, the plot of degrees awarded over time is fairly irregular, showing more annual variation in production than should probably be expected of a system with a well defined enrollment management plan. Perhaps efforts to decrease annual variation should be considered.

When the System's pattern of ups and downs without clear overall increase or decrease, is viewed in terms of its campus components, several features become clear (see Figure 1).

• While the overall pattern of annual degrees awarded by UM-Columbia is fairly flat, annual change

has been surprisingly erratic and recent history shows recovery from a sharply declining trend (FY93-FY97).

- The trend of annual number of degrees awarded by UM-Kansas City shows consistent growth in recent years with the number of degrees awarded in 1999 surpassing to the previous high (FY93). Fiscal 2000 saw degrees awarded decline modestly.
- Degrees awarded by UM-Rolla show a relatively smooth pattern of increase through FY85, a smooth declining pattern through FY91, and a fairly stable pattern from FY91 through FY00. Annual change showed little change in FY00.
- The campus most clearly showing consistent long-term growth in the number of degrees awarded is UM-St. Louis. From a low of 1,494 in FY84, the number of degrees awarded annually has steadily increased to over 2,300 (almost 50%).

The pattern of degrees awarded by level within campus is interesting and in some cases counterintuitive (see Figure 2). Some of these patterns are discussed below.

## **UM-Columbia**

- Focusing on recent history, after several years of decline in the number of bachelor and masters degrees awarded, beginning in the early 90s, bachelor degrees recovered sharply and are now at a 20-year high. Masters degrees have not recovered and have only recently stopped declining.
- Number of professional degrees awarded decreased by 5% in FY00 but were well above the prior 5- and 10 years averages.
- Last year's report made special note of the FY99 decline in number of doctorates awarded. Doctorates were up 11% annually in FY00 and up 3% and 4% when compared to 5- and 10-year averages.

Whatever the explanation found for UM-Columbia's undulating campus patterns, the campus trends often obscure more inconsistent college-level patterns (see Table 2.1). A few of these will be noted in the following comments, however, much attention has been focused recently on the decline in masters degree production and that should be acknowledged first as a campus pattern. Compared to the prior 10-year average, masters degrees were down 43% in agriculture, 32% in arts and science, 13% in education, 39% in engineering, 11% in journalism, and 36% in nursing. On a more positive note, the pattern of degree production in the College of Arts and Science illustrates remarkable recovery and new levels of success with degree production at the bachelors and doctoral levels reaching 20-year highs.

The number of degrees awarded by the College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources has declined sharply from almost 600 to about 400 over the 20 years. Fiscal 2000 showed some recovery at the bachelors level

The largest college, Arts and Sciences, showed fairly consistent growth in degree production from the late 1970s through FY94 and rapid decline since FY94. Recovery began in FY98, continued into FY99, and reached a 20-year high in FY00. In contrast, masters degree production continues to decline.

Since FY92, the number of degrees awarded by the College of Business and Public Administration declined sharply to a local low point in FY97. Masters degrees bounced back in FY00 and bachelors degrees showed continued recovery.

In FY00, degrees awarded at the bachelors level by the College of Education are one-half the number awarded 20 years before. Degree production at the masters and doctoral levels is also below 20-year averages.

Perhaps the best that can be said of degree production in engineering is that slide was apparently stopped in FY99. In fact, total degrees awarded in FY99 were the same as FY98 and current annual growth was strong at the bachelors (15%) and doctoral (10%) levels.

The number of degrees awarded in the School of Health Related Professions increased sharply from FY78 to FY85 and has fluctuated within 25% below this level since FY85 until this year. Annual change in the number of degrees produced dropped sharply in FY00 (-37%).

In FY00, degree production at the bachelors level reached a 20-year high in the College of Human Environmental Sciences. Across time, the pattern of degrees awarded has shown much variability, with peaks and valleys throughout the 20-year period. That pattern of variance continued in FY99, illustrating a local peak, when the number of degrees awarded increased by 14%.

In FY97 the number of degrees awarded in the School of Journalism had declined by about 30% when compared to 10 years before. FY98 showed a sharp reversal in the trend and that recovery appears to have leveled at about 350 overall.

The School of Law produced a record number of JDs in FY99. The FY99 figure was about 30% higher than the fairly stable level of the preceding 5 years and was the result of a large increase in the number of students enrolled in law. That figure dropped in FY00 by 11%.

In contrast to law, the School of Medicine continued to award relatively fewer MDs than has historically been the case. The number of masters degrees was up sharply, erasing the decline seen in FY99.

The School of Natural Resources sharply increased the number of degrees awarded in FY99 but returned to more typical, 5- to 10-year, levels in FY00.

From FY79 to the mid 1980s, the pattern of degrees awarded in the School of Nursing might

be compared to a roller coaster. Between FY78 to FY91, the number of degrees awarded nearly doubled (100 to 193) then returned to the starting level (98). The number of degrees awarded more recently has been much more stable and in FY00, nearly reached the record number of FY94.

## **UM-Kansas City**

Kansas City's College of Arts and Sciences was a bright spot in FY99 and continued to produce record numbers of graduates in FY00. At 814 degrees awarded in FY00, the college produced very nearly the same number of degrees as in FY98, 16% more than the FY95-FY99 average and 31% more than the average for the prior 10-years.

Degrees awarded in biological sciences have varied markedly over the prior 10-year period, appeared to be reaching a more stable level in FY99, and then dropped very sharply in FY00 to 20-year lows.

Degrees awarded in business and public administration declined from 626 in FY89 to a recent low of 346 in FY00. In addition, the 20-year record established in number of masters degrees produced in FY99 was quickly lost in FY00.

It continues to appear as if dentistry is stabilizing at about 125 degrees and certificates awarded annually.

The College of Education continued its unusual pattern of degree production into FY00. Bachelor degrees are now at the lowest level in over 20 years and masters degrees have increased only slightly. Over the past decade degree production has dropped from 521 (FY91) to just over 200 (FY98-FY00).

Law produced a record number of JDs in FY99 then returned to levels reminiscent of the 1980s and early 1990.

Medicine recovered in FY99 to near its historic average number of degrees produced and continued that level into FY00.

Change figures for the Conservatory show exaggerated variation due to its small size. The number of degrees produced by the Conservatory is actually fairly stable when viewed long-term.

Nursing has maintained a steady total number of degrees produced for three years. However, the composition of degrees has changed with more bachelor degrees replacing fewer masters degrees.

Pharmacy has completed its transitional phase from bachelors to doctor of pharmacy degrees and is producing degrees at a rate similar to the 10-year average.

## UM-Rolla

The School of Engineering produced fewer degrees in FY00 than at any time since FY80.

The number of degrees awarded in Arts and Sciences was up 4% in FY00 due to a sharp increase in master degree production.

In FY00, degree production by Mines and Metallurgy returned to the levels of FY94-FY97.

## UM-St. Louis


Degree production in Arts and Sciences has increased steadily over the past 20 years until 860 degrees were awarded in FY00, a high point. The number of degrees awarded at the bachelor level has increased from about 400 in the early 1970s to well over 700 in FY00.

Business Administration reversed a downward trend in FY99 that began in about FY91 and has continued to grow in FY00.

After relatively high levels of degree production from FY91-FY99, peaking in FY97, the number of degrees awarded by the School of Education appears to be in decline.

Both the number of bachelors and masters degrees in Nursing were down sharply in FY00.

**Figure 1: Total Degrees Awarded by Campus** 










Figure 1: Total Degrees Awarded by Campus - Continued






# **Figure 1: Total Degrees Awarded by Campus**







**Figure 2: Total Degrees Awarded by Campus** 




**Figure 2: Total Degrees Awarded by Campus** 











**Figure 2: Total Degrees Awarded by Campus** 











**Figure 2: Total Degrees Awarded by Campus**
