Changes to This Year's SFA Component

- SFA is now part of the Winter collection. The Winter collection will close for keyholders on February 6, 2013.
- In Part E (data for Group 4), Column 2 has been revised for clarity. It now more clearly matches with the data in Column 3.

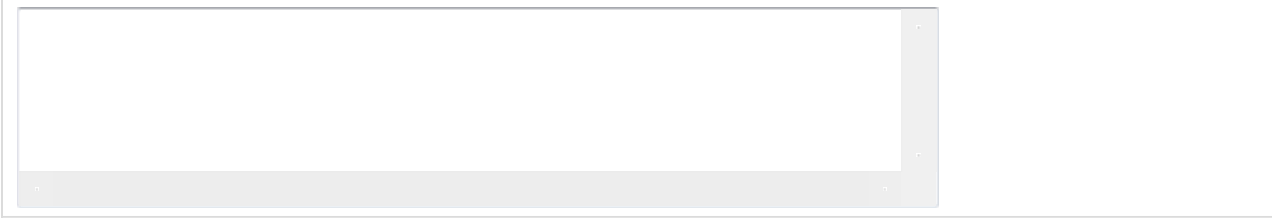

Reason:	The University saw an increase in average test scores and high school GPAs, which resulted in a direct increase in merit scholarships. The University also increased housing scholarships and need-based institutional grants.

Reason:	The biggest change was the loss of Academic Competitiveness Grants (ACG). The sheer number of \$750 awards from ACG greatly reduced the average award per student in Fall 2010 vs. Fall 2011. Without ACG Grants in Fall 2010, the average per students in Fal 2010 is over \$1,500 per student. Also, the University saw an increase in average test scores and high school GPAs, which resulted in a direct increase in merit scholarships. The University also increased housing scholarships and need-based institutional grants.
