

For UM, the restrictions announced include the following:

MU:

- \$5 million of the \$10 million appropriation in HB2017 for the Applied Learning Center for the Trulaske College of Business. This is a 50-50 match project.
- \$3 million of the \$5 million in HB2003 authorized to be split between MU School of Medicine and the Truman Medical Center to enhance learning technology.
- \$2 million appropriated in HB2007 for expansion of the MU Research Reactor through the Department of Economic Development.
- \$275,000 in HB2003 for MU's Greenley Research Center to conduct water quality research.
- \$250,000 of the \$500,000 in HB2003 in one-time funds to MU's College of Veterinary Medicine for equipment purchases.
- \$250,000 in HB2006 for the Delta Research Center for Asian carp control through the Department of Agriculture.
- \$10,000 in HB2006 for the MU abattoir through the Department of Agriculture.

UMKC:

- \$2.3 million of the \$7.4 million appropriation in HB2017 to UMKC for the Plaster Free Enterprise Center. This is a 50-50 match.
- \$400,000 in HB2003 and \$150,000 in HB2007 for the UMKC Neighborhood Initiative

Missouri S&T:

- \$500,000 of the \$1 million appropriation in HB2003 to Missouri S&T to launch an engineering partnership with Clay County.
- \$200,000 of the \$400,000 appropriated in HB2003 to Missouri S&T for Project Lead The Way enhancements.

UM Related/other:

- \$1.5 million core increase in HB2003 for the Missouri Telehealth Network
- \$750,000 of a \$1 million core increase in HB2003 for the Missouri State Historical Society
- \$750,000 in staffing funds in HB2003 for the University of Missouri System Review Commission.
- \$150,000 in staffing funds in HB2003 for the Department of Higher Education to cover costs associated with a review of mission and degree approval policies.
