

### **GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

Scholarships of varying amounts based on a range of factors. Complete the MU Annual Scholarship Application to qualify. Read your Financial Aid Award Letter in March to see what you've been awarded.

### NEED-BASED AID

Reserved for students whose families have higher financial need. Be sure to file the FAFSA to qualify for the maximum.

### **GRANTS\***

Based on a range of factors, primarily centered on financial need. They're like scholarships and don't need to be repaid.

# LOANS\*

The FAFSA is required to qualify for federal loans. We also offer access to parent loans. And friendly, helpful staff to help you find the best solution.



# **STEPS**

- **Submit an application** online and the \$55 application fee. Admission is rolling so you will receive a decision about two weeks after we receive your completed application.
- Request that official high school transcripts be sent to the MU Office of Admissions at 230 Jesse Hall, Columbia, MO 65211.
- Request that official test scores be sent to Mizzou directly from ACT (code: 2382) or the College Board if you took the SAT (code: 6875).


# **DEADLINES**

Nov. 15 — Apply for admission before Nov. 15 of your senior year to be considered for ALL the scholarships you might be eligible for. Note: You can apply to Mizzou later than this, but you may miss out on some great scholarships.

**Dec. 1 — Log into ScholarshipUniverse** to answer a series of matching questions that will direct you to applications to complete for maximum scholarship consideration.

Jan. 1 — Submit your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form by Jan. 1 for priority consideration for loans and grants. Some scholarships require you submit your FAFSA before the general priority date. The FAFSA opens in Oct. of your senior year and uses your family's IRS income and tax information from the previous year.

# **STEPS**

- Submit an application online and the \$55 application fee. Admission is rolling so you will receive a decision about two weeks after we receive your completed application.
- Request that official high school transcripts be sent to the MU Office of Admissions at 230 Jesse Hall, Columbia, MO 65211.
- Request that official test scores be sent to Mizzou directly from ACT (code: 2382) or the College Board if you took the SAT (code: 6875).

# **DEADLINES**

Nov. 15 — Apply for admission before Nov. 15 of your senior year to be considered for ALL the scholarships you might be eligible for. Note: You can apply to Mizzou later than this, but you may miss out on some great scholarships.

**Dec. 1 — Log into ScholarshipUniverse** to answer a series of matching questions that will direct you to applications to complete for maximum scholarship consideration.

Jan. 1 — Submit your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form by Jan. 1 for priority consideration for loans and grants. Some scholarships require you submit your FAFSA before the general priority date. The FAFSA opens in Oct. of your senior year and uses your family's IRS income and tax information from the previous year.
