

QUESTION	ANSWER
Player intro – how many players are you introducing and how often do you shoot off fireworks? Each player, at the end of the intro?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Football – shoot off fireworks as team takes the field approx. five minutes before kickoff (not during starter introductions)• Basketball – shoot at 1-2 “key moments” during the intro video, after each of the five starting players and the head coach (six total) are introduced
National Anthem – where is the pyro location? Both sides of the rim?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Football – north concourse• Basketball – national anthem pyro would need to come from an attachment on the stanchion arm behind the backboard (see sample image below with flames coming up from behind the backboard) 

<p>Touchdowns – fireworks after TD only – or extra point also?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After touchdowns and extra points would be preferred
<p>Indoor events – what looking for, placement of the scoreboard, ceiling height, along with other stadium details needed to determine what you can do in the arena. What sports are included? One location or multiple locations?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Basketball – would look to shoot from the stanchion arm that connects to the back of the backboard (example pictured above) • Gymnastics – would look to shoot from a location on the floor, such as the example pictured below  <p>The photograph shows a gymnast in a white leotard and black skirt performing a handstand on a circular platform. <p>What details can you provide on launch location? Is there a site map?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Football – fireworks have historically been shot from the roofs of the team store, ticket office and concession stands on the north concourse. They have also been shot from the roof of the south endzone. Both areas are highlighted on the image below. Note that the south endzone building was added after this image was taken • Basketball – would look to shoot from an attachment on the stanchion arm that connects to the back of the backboard (example pictured above)

	
<p>Fireworks Displays – how often and any details on what you want?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Frequency of traditional 4-6 minute fireworks shows would be contingent upon several factors, primarily budget. We have not done post-game fireworks shows in the past but may consider them in the future. We would likely do no more than 2-3/year, if we're able to do them at all.
<p>Is there a budget per event?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Football: \$7,500-12,500/game • Indoor events: \$1,000-2,500/game • Post-game shows: \$4,000-6,000/show
