
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

Q1 - What University of Missouri System campus are you currently enrolled in?





Q2 - Are you currently an undergraduate or graduate student?





Q3 - Are you an International student?





Q4 - Select your race / ethnicity.





Q5 - Did you vote in the 2016 elections?





Q7 - Where are you registered to vote?



Q8 - On a scale of 1 to 10, how politically active are you? (1 = not at all active; 10 = extremely active)






I am a transfer student from a community college so this is only my first year. I don't have much experience with the administration, but they seem to care about the students and faculty.






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Q12 - This year, state funding for higher education has declined significantly. If you had to choose, would you prefer...





Q13 - Do you support allowing individuals to carry concealed firearms on your campus?









Q16 - Was this the result of, or made worse by, your college experience?





Q17 - Do you know anyone who has experienced a mental health issue while enrolled in college?





Q18 - Compared to one year ago, do you believe mental health issues on your campus have gotten better, worse, or stayed about the same?





Q20 - Compared to one year ago, do you believe sexual assault / relationship violence on your campus have gotten better, worse, or stayed about the same?












