# ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS REPORT 2006

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### Enrollment Projections Report, 2006 Office of Institutional Research and Planning University of Missouri System

#### **Executive Summary**

The *Enrollment Projections Report*, 2006 includes University of Missouri enrollment projections for each of the four campuses and the System. Organized according to student level, it provides headcount and credit hour projections for the next five years. Each campus made headcount and credit hour projections, which are presented in this report unaltered. The totals for the UM System were calculated by adding totals from each of the four UM campuses. Special thanks to the following representatives who provided the enrollment projections for their campus: Kathy J. Haynes at UM-Columbia, Mel Tyler at UM-Kansas City, Carol Heddinghaus at UM-Rolla, and Linda Silman at UM-St. Louis.

These enrollment projections were made in consideration of the enrollment management plans on each campus, in concert with the impact that these projections will have on the budget for each campus.

The highlights of the report include:

- Total on-campus, on-schedule headcount at the University of Missouri System is expected to increase 5% from 55,964 in the fall of 2005 to 58,929 in the fall of 2010. All campuses expect an increase in enrollment ranging from a slight 1% increase on the Kansas City campus to a 15% increase on the Rolla campus (Table 1).
- System-wide, undergraduate headcount is expected to increase from 42,042 in fall of 2005 to 44,158 in the fall of 2010, reflecting an increase of 5% (Table 1).
- Over the next five years, overall graduate headcount at UM is expected to increase by 6%. A 9% increase in graduate enrollment is expected on the Columbia campus. Graduate enrollment is expected to increase 5% on the St. Louis campus. No change in graduate enrollment is expected at the Kansas City campus. A 14% increase in graduate enrollment is predicted for the Rolla campus (Table 1).
- Full-time, first-time freshmen enrollment system-wide at the University of Missouri is projected to increase 5% over the next five years (Table 2). The Columbia, Rolla and St. Louis campuses expect increases of 6%, 3%, and 16%, respectively. No change in freshmen enrollment is expected at the Kansas City campus.
- Over the next five years, the Columbia and Kansas City campuses expect no change in the percentage of undergraduates who are Missouri residents, 86% and 73%, respectively (Table 3). Both the St. Louis and Rolla campuses predict a 1% increase. The percentage of resident graduate students is expected to hold steady at 56% on the Columbia campus and 57% on the Kansas City campus. Both the Rolla and St. Louis campuses expect slight increases in graduate student enrollment.
- Undergraduate on-campus, on-schedule credit hours across the System should see a 5% increase from approximately 541,837 credit hours in fall of 2005 to nearly 566,541 credit hours in the fall of 2010 (Appendix Table E).

#### **Organization of Report**

The text of this report, "Basis for Enrollment Projections by Campus" refers to Tables 1-3 located in the body of the report. Please note, however, that more detailed information about the campus projections can be found in the appendix. Organized by campus, the tables in the appendix illustrate expected enrollment changes at the lower and upper-division undergraduate levels, projections for each professional program (e.g., law, pharmacy, optometry, etc.), and enrollment forecasts at the graduate level. The appendix also includes more detailed information concerning the percentage of Missouri residents by level and the percentage of full-time students by level.

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#### **Basis for On-Campus Enrollment Projections by Campus**

Making these projections requires the careful consideration of factors influencing future enrollments. For instance, each of the following could potentially influence enrollment: the effectiveness of an institution's recruiting and marketing strategy; shifts in the number of seniors graduating from high school; the national economy and state budget cuts in higher education; retention rates of students enrolled; and current tuition levels along with anticipated increases. In addition, the competitiveness of other institutions vying for the same students; the availability of transfer students; changes in admission standards; new state policies or programs; and high school student interest in specific fields can all play a role. The basis for projecting enrollment growth at each campus is unique.

#### UM-Columbia

- Total on-campus, on-schedule headcount is expected to increase 4% from 26,618 in 2005 to 27,581 in 2010 (Table 1). Steady enrollment growth is expected at all levels, undergraduate, graduate and first-professional.
- Total on-campus undergraduate headcount at MU is expected to increase 2% from 21,126 in 2005 to 21,632 in 2010 (Table 1). This projection takes into account a three-year rolling average of year-to-year retention rates observed at MU (freshmen to sophomore; sophomore to junior; junior to senior; seniors returning for fifth year or more).
- A 9% increase in graduate enrollment is expected at MU (Table 1).
- The number of first-time, degree-seeking freshmen is expected to increase by 6% (Table 2). This projection is based on a) the number of high school graduates projected in Missouri for the coming year and the historical percentage that MU typically matriculates; and b) next take a three year average of in-state students to all first-time college to predict upcoming years. Although a 6% increase is expected over the next five years, in FY07 in-state, first-time college enrollment will be flat and out-of-state, first-time college enrollment will be down.
- First-professional enrollment at MU is expected to increase by 4% through 2010 (Appendix Table A).

#### UM-Kansas City

- The University of Missouri-Kansas City is projecting a relatively flat student headcount out to Fall 2010 with the exception of the new satellite Pharmacy program in Columbia, which will be adding 28 students each year (Appendix Table B). The additional increase in pharmacy students will produce an overall 9% increase in first-professional enrollment from 1,523 students in Fall 2005 to 1,663 students in 2010.
- UMKC is experiencing a change in leadership and a tightening of focus which has provided an opportunity to update the strategic enrollment management plan. The results of UMKC's self-study will be used to update the enrollment management plan. It is anticipated that the self-study will be completed by the end of next year and the results will enable more accurate projections of student enrollment out to 2010.

#### UM-Rolla

- Total on-campus, on-schedule headcount at UM-Rolla is expected to increase 15% from 5,100 in 2005 to 5,844 in 2010 (Table 1).
- Total undergraduate enrollment is expected to increase from 4,248 in 2005 to 4,874 in 2010 (Table 1). Transfer and non-degree seeking enrollment patterns influence undergraduate projections and are based on the historical patterns over the past several years. For FY2007, transfer numbers are expected to grow by 1% to 4%. Continuing student enrollment patterns also influence undergraduate projections and are based on actual retention rates observed at UMR (Freshman to freshman; freshman to sophomore; sophomore to junior; junior to senior; seniors returning for fifth year or more).
- A three percent increase is expected in first-time, degree-seeking freshmen headcount at UM-Rolla from 879 in 2005 to 902 in 2010 (Table 2). The first-time college student projection is based on the number of high school graduates and prospective engineering students projected in Missouri for the coming year and the three year average of admitted students who enroll the following fall semester. For FY2007 the numbers have been adjusted based on the ACT, WICHE and MODESE student market information that predicts first-time college students will be flat. Based on applications and deposits received as of March 1, 2006, the projection appears to be in line with the enrollment estimates.
- Graduate enrollment at UM-Rolla is expected to increase by 14%, from 852 in 2005 to 970 in 2010 (Appendix Table C). The masters and Ph.D. campus enrollments were set by averaging the retention rates for the continuing students. The last three-year average of admit to enrollee yield rates were used to estimate the number of new students. The yield rates and projected enrollments were adjusted by considering the domestic and international admission to enrollee levels. Distance Education enrollment is estimated at a 10% increase per year.

#### UM-St. Louis

- The St. Louis campus expects a 9% increase in total on-campus, on-schedule headcount from 2005 to 2010 (Table 1). Enrollment in the Optometry program is expected to remain steady at 164 while undergraduate and graduate enrollments are expected to increase 11% and 5%, respectively.
- The 11% projected increase in total on-campus undergraduate headcount is based on a prior 5-year average of transfers, re-enrolls, and continuing students. UM-St. Louis has also increased scholarships to have an impact on retention.
- First-time, degree-seeking freshmen headcount is expected to increase from 498 in 2005 to 577 in 2010, an increase of 16% (Table 2). This prediction is based on a 5-year average of yield from Missouri high school seniors and a 5-year average of non-resident, first-time freshmen. Although state and national trends show a decline in the number of high school seniors/graduates, a new scholarship approach will be used at UM-St. Louis to reverse the downward trend.
- An expected zero percent increase in Optometry and five percent increase in graduate enrollment is based on a 5-year average headcount of those student levels (Appendix Table D).

#### UM System Total

- Overall, on-campus, on-schedule enrollment for the UM System is expected to increase by 5% over the next five years (Table 1). On-campus undergraduate enrollment is expected to increase the most, going from 42,042 in Fall 2005 to an expected 44,158 in 2010 (an increase of 5%).
- A 7% increase in professional enrollments is expected due partially to the UMKC pharmacy students that will be enrolled at the UMC campus (Table 1).
- Graduate enrollment is expected to increase by 6% (Table 1).
- First-time freshmen enrollment is expected to increase by 5% (Table 2).
- Total student credit hours across the System is expected to increase 5% from 701,529 in Fall 2005 to 735,890 in Fall 2010 (Appendix Table E).
