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Enrollment Projections Report, 2004 Office of Institutional Research and Planning University of Missouri System

Executive Summary

The *Enrollment Projections Report*, 2004 includes University of Missouri enrollment projections for each of the four campuses and the System. Organized according to student level, it provides headcount and credit hour projections for the next five years. Each campus made headcount and credit hour projections, which are presented in this report unaltered. The totals for the UM System were calculated by adding totals from each of the four UM campuses. Special thanks to the following representatives who provided the enrollment projections for their campus: Kathy J. Haynes at UM-Columbia, Jennifer Spielvogel at UM-Kansas City, David Saphian at UM-Rolla, and Linda Silman at UM-St. Louis.

The highlights of the report include:

- System-wide, undergraduate headcount is expected to increase from 40,183 in fall of 2003 to 44,109 in the fall of 2008, reflecting an increase of 10% (Table 1).
- Over the next five years, graduate headcount is expected to increase system-wide by 12%. Graduate enrollment is expected to increase on all campuses. The Kansas City campus anticipates a 1% increase, the Columbia campus a 13% increase, and the Rolla campus expects a 4% increase in graduate headcount. The St. Louis campus expects the largest increase at 28% (Table 1).
- Over the next five years, the Columbia campus expects no change in the percentage of undergraduates who are Missouri residents (87%). The St. Louis campus predicts a 2% increase, the Kansas City campus a 1% decrease, and Rolla predicts a 4% increase. Both the Columbia and Kansas City campuses predict no change in the percentage of graduate students who are Missouri residents. St. Louis predicts a 2% increase and Rolla a 7% increase (Table 3).
- Freshmen enrollment is expected to decrease by 4% at the Columbia campus while the Kansas City and Rolla campuses are predicting increases of 10% and 3%, respectively (Appendix Tables A, B, & C). St. Louis anticipates the largest increase, a projected growth of 93% (Appendix Table D). Full-time, first-time freshmen enrollment system-wide at the University of Missouri is projected to increase 6% over the next five years (Appendix Table E).
- Undergraduate on-campus, on-schedule credit hours across the System should see a 9% increase from approximately 509,684 credit hours in fall of 2003 to nearly 554,777 credit hours in the fall of 2008 (Appendix Table E).

Organization of Report

The text of this report refers to Tables 1-3 located in the body of the report. Please note, however, that more detailed information about the campus projections can be found in the appendix. Organized by campus, the tables in the appendix illustrate expected enrollment changes at the lower and upper-division undergraduate levels, projections for each professional program (e.g., law, pharmacy, optometry, etc.), and enrollment forecasts at the graduate level. The appendix also includes more detailed information concerning the percentage of Missouri residents by level and the percentage of full-time students by level.

Considerations in Making Enrollment Projections

Making these projections requires the careful consideration of factors influencing future enrollments. For instance, each of the following could potentially influence enrollment: the effectiveness of an institution's recruiting and marketing strategy; shifts in the number of seniors graduating from high school; the national economy and state budget cuts in higher education; retention rates of students enrolled; and current tuition levels along with anticipated increases. In addition, the competitiveness of other institutions vying for the same students; the availability of transfer students; changes in admission standards; new state policies or programs; and high school student interest in specific fields can all play a role.

Several factors influence *on-campus* enrollment projections at the University of Missouri. Foremost, the various enrollment management approaches utilized by each of the four campuses continue to influence five-year projections. For example, both the St. Louis and Kansas City campuses are focused on and implementing strategies to increase the number of first-time freshmen. For the Columbia campus, the strategic planning focused on graduate education continues to impact the expected increase in enrollments at the Masters and Doctoral levels over the next five years. The undergraduate enrollment projections at the Columbia campus are derived by separately examining first-time college students, transfers, and continuing and readmitted students. Projections are then made for each category. The Rolla campus has activities, plans, and degree programs in place to achieve the projected total enrollment growth of 16%. At Rolla, first-time freshmen and new transfer student projections are based on high school graduate projections, applications, and recruitment plans. New graduate projections are based on application trends and recruitment plans. Returning and readmit student estimates are based on retention, return, readmit and graduation rates for previous fall and winter semesters with a slight improvement planned for first-time freshmen return rates.

On-Campus Enrollment Projections

UM-Columbia

Total on-campus, on-schedule headcount is expected to increase 4% from 25,400 in 2003 to 26,514 in 2008 (Table 1). Total undergraduate enrollment is expected to increase by 3% while the number of first-time degree-seeking freshmen is expected to decrease by 4%. This is based on the number of high students expected to graduate in Missouri and the percentages of these students that typically attend UMC. Continuing uncertainty about fee increases amidst state budget cuts lead the Columbia campus to be conservative in the projection of first-time college students for next year (Table 2). Graduate enrollment is expected to increase by 13%, while first-professional enrollment is expected to decrease by 3%. The percentage of undergraduates who are Missouri residents and percentage of students enrolled full-time at UMC are expected to remain the same at 87% and 95%, respectively (Table 3).

UM-Kansas City

The Kansas City campus is predicting a smaller enrollment increase than previously expected. Over the next five years, total enrollment is expected to increase by 7% to approximately 15,152 students; with the largest being a 13% expected increase at the undergraduate level. Graduate enrollment is anticipated to grow only slightly at 1% and first-professional enrollment is expected to stay relatively stable (Table 1). First-time, degree-seeking freshmen enrollment is projected to increase by 10% (Table 2), partially due in anticipation of the opening of Oak Street Residence Hall in Fall 2004. Although UMKC is implementing enrollment management efforts aimed toward graduate education, it is expected for it to take some time before the efforts impact enrollment. Full-time enrollment at the undergraduate level is projected to remain at 74% over the next five years (Table 3).

UM-Rolla

The Rolla campus anticipates the largest percentage increase in on-campus, on-schedule enrollment over the next five years. Anticipating an overall 17% increase, most of this growth is expected at the undergraduate level (Table 1). By 2008, undergraduate enrollment is expected to reach 4,801, an increase of 20% from Fall 2003. Graduate enrollment is expected to reach 1,108, an anticipated increase of 4% over the next five years. First-time freshmen headcount is expected to increase by 3% (Table 2). An increase in the percentage of Missouri residents is expected at both levels. The percentages of undergraduates and graduate students enrolled full-time are expected to remain the same at 92% and 71% respectively (Table 3).

UM-St. Louis

Overall on-campus enrollment is projected to increase 20% over the next five years at UMSL; this is considerably higher than last year's prediction of 3%. Undergraduate enrollment is expected to increase by 18%, graduate enrollment by 28%, and professional enrollment by 1% (Table 1). First-time freshmen headcount is expected to increase by 93% over the next five years (Table 2). The percent of students that are Missouri residents is expected to increase by 2% at the undergraduate and graduate levels and remain the same at the first-professional level. The percentage of undergraduates enrolled full-time is expected to increase to 61% while the first-professional and graduate levels are expected to remain the same (Table 3).

UM System Total

Overall, on-campus, on-schedule enrollment for the UM System is expected to increase by 10% (Table 1). Total undergraduate enrollment should increase by 10% and graduate enrollment by 12%. First-professional enrollment is expected to decrease by 1%. First-time freshmen enrollment is projected to increase by 6% (Table 2).
